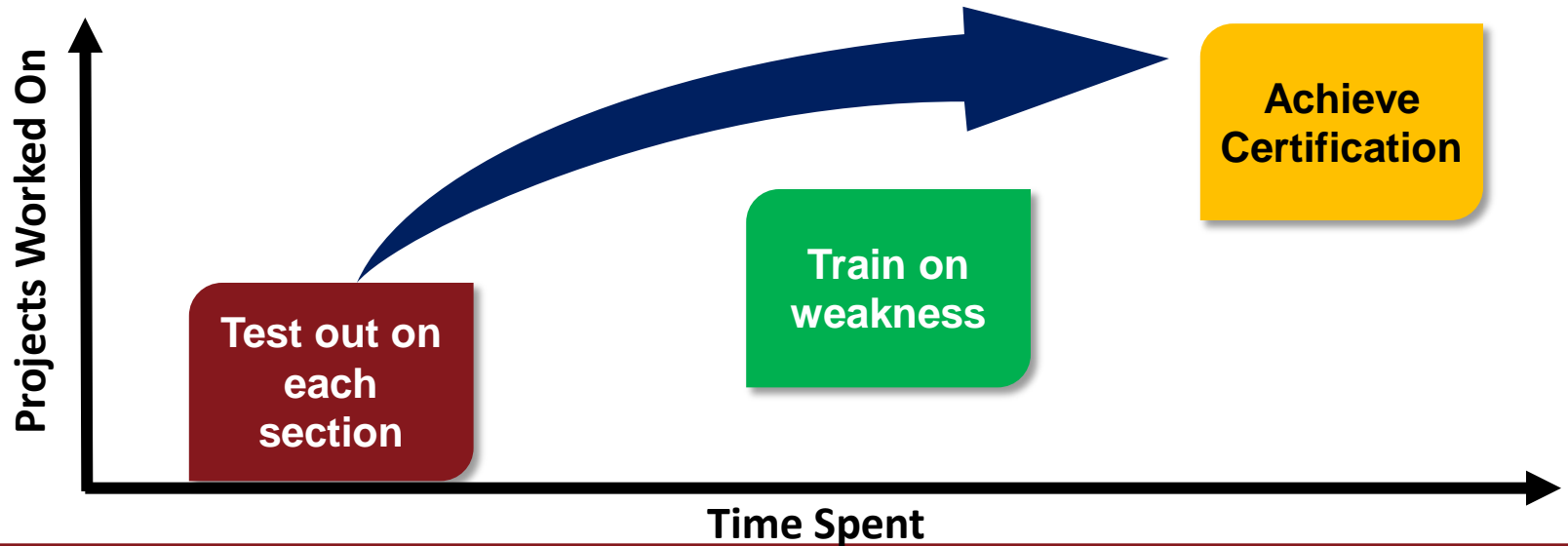
The Groups Provided a total of 55 IRP's for all repair aspects to complete our task.
